Equine Health Policy & Entry Requirements

The Lewiston Roundup Association (LRA) is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy environment for all equines utilizing our facilities. The following equine health requirements apply to **all horses boarding, hauling in, or participating in events** on Lewiston Roundup grounds.

Required Health Documentation

All horses entering or remaining on the Lewiston Roundup grounds must have the following documentation available upon request:

1. Health Certificates

- **Out-of-state horses:**
A valid **Equine Health Certificate issued within the previous six (6) months** is required for interstate travel and entry onto the facility.
- **In-state horses:**
Must comply with current Idaho State Veterinarian requirements.
- Health certificates must be issued by a licensed veterinarian.

2. Coggins Test

- A **current negative Coggins test** is required:
 - At the time of entry onto the grounds
 - Must be **updated annually**
- If a Coggins test is set to expire within one (1) month, it must be renewed prior to or during the horse's stay to remain compliant.

3. Vaccination Requirements

All horses must provide **proof of annual vaccinations**, including:

- **5-way or 6-way core vaccine**, which includes:
 - Equine Influenza
 - Equine Rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 & EHV-4)
- **Strangles** – Risk-based, recommended annually, not mandatory
- **West Nile Virus** – Risk-based, recommended annually, not mandatory

Due to exposure risks at public facilities and events, **Influenza and EHV vaccines are strongly recommended to be boosted every six (6) months.**

Inspections & Recordkeeping

- All **boarders and haul-in horses** may be subject to **random inspections** to verify compliance with health documentation and vaccination requirements.
- Boarder records will be maintained in a centralized tracking system to monitor expiration dates and ensure timely updates.

Compliance

Failure to provide required documentation upon request may result in denial of entry, removal from the premises, or refusal of stall access. These measures are in place to protect the health and welfare of all equines using the Lewiston Roundup facilities.
